

FROM THE DESK OF... LIANNE FORMAN

On October 25th, I was invited to present at the Annual Bergen County Prosecutor's Office SNAP Conference on our prevention education programs in Jewish schools across the country.

At that conference, I was privy to statistics and information on drug seizures in Bergen County and the prevalence of Fentanyl being laced into many substances, not just heroin.

Fentanyl now accounts for the majority of opioid-related overdoses in the United States.

It's potency is dangerous, with two milligrams of fentanyl (which is equivalent to two grains of sand - see picture above for scale) being considered a lethal dose.

While it is not common, it is not unheard of that Fentanyl is found in marijuana - whether by design or accidental cross-contamination. According to the DEA, Fentanyl is showing up everywhere and we cannot rule out the possibility of it being found in marijuana as well.

As we teach about the dangers of marijuana, regardless of its legality for users over the age of 21, talking about its potency and risks, this is also something we must keep in mind and warn about as well.




